

## Appendix 2

The information and statistics on the held Creative Sessions in Wuppertal and Tehran, their participants, and the collected drawings.

#### **INTRODUCTION**

In this file, each table presents the information about the Creative Sessions that have been held in the same institute in Wuppertal or Tehran. Two sessions were held as Pilot Test Session at the Von der Heydt-Museum in order to develop and design the toolkit and methodology of Creative Session. Except these two Pilot Test Sessions, all the Creative Sessions were hold in kindergartens and primary schools.

There are some points to keep in mind:

• A few of children – participants in Creative Sessions— were older than 8 or younger than 4 years old. It means they were not in the aimed age group which is from 4 to 8 years old. Thus, the paintings of these participants are not considered as the correct samples in order to be analysed in next phase. Thus, these names have been crossed out like this: Marie, 8, Girl.

Also, the participants in the Pilot Test Sessions and the collected drawings in these sessions are not considered as correct samples; thus, the names of the participants, have been crossed out. In short, by crossing out, the incorrect samples, participants, and sessions are defined in order to be omitted from the tables. These samples are not considered as the practical ones for next phases.

- A few of children participated two times in Creative Session. To show this, their name have been marked by this sign \* in their second participation (e.g., \*Olivia, 5 years old).
- Sometimes in Creative Sessions, two participants were sisters or brothers; in this case, their names have been connected by these signs 1 in the table.
- In Iran, the educational system in primary schools is single-sex education. It means, each Iranian primary school is either for boys' participation or girls' participation and it is not mixed. Thus, the participants in the Creative Sessions that were held in Iranian primary schools, were of the same gender, either boys or girls.
